This packed tour of Central Europe focuses on Hungary and the Czech Republic with the opportunity to visit the respective capitals of Budapest and Prague. In addition, we spend time on Lake Balaton in Hungary and around the towns of Ceske Budejovice and Brno in The Czech Republic. Our route takes us through France and Germany into Austria where we will visit the capital, Vienna. Our route back allows a brief visit to Slovakia, with the chance to visit the capital Bratislava. This is an exciting and adventurous tour, which provides a real flavour of the richness and diversity of Central Europe along with five capital cities as we take in Luxembourg City on the return leg.

ITINERARY:

NIGHT BEFORE: We stay on a campsite close to Dover where we provide a full briefing for the tour and advice on motorhoming on the continent in general. This is a complimentary night and you are welcome to join us at no additional cost.

DAY 1: We take the early ferry to France and head deep into the Champagne region with an overnight stop near Reims.

DAY 2: We travel east through France into Luxembourg. Our schedule allows of an afternoon and evening in Luxembourg City, which is easily accessible from our campsite.

DAYS 3 - 4: We follow the path of the Moselle River as we head into Germany with a two night stop-over on the Rhine River. Here you have the chance to visit the picture-postcard town of Rudesheim. Famed for its wine-making, the town boasts a network of narrow streets bustling with shops and restaurants.

DAY 5: We continue our drive across overnight stop close to the historic city of Nuremberg.

DAYS 6 - 8: Today we head for our campsite close to the Czech capital, Prague. The city is perhaps one of Europe's finest destinations packed with history, art and architecture.

DAYS 9 - 10: We head through Slovakia today with the chance to stop off in the capital Bratislava, or at the smaller walled town of Trnava. Our destination for the next two nights is the Czech Republic's second largest city, Brno.

DAYS 11 - 13: The tour now enters Hungary for the first time with a trip to the capital, Budapest where our schedule allows for two full days in the city. Straddling the Danube, many of the city's most beautiful sites are located on either bank of the river.

DAYS 14 - 16: We take a relatively short drive today with Lake Balaton as our destination. At 230 square miles, it is the largest freshwater lake in Central Europe and its shores are home to many interesting resort towns. Our schedule allows two days to explore the area, which can be done by boat, bike, bus, rail or road.

DAYS 17 - 19: We head into Austria today close to the capital Vienna. Visually stunning, the city is home to many fine buildings, churches, palaces and museums and has a packed cultural calendar. Slovakia's capital, Bratislava is just an hour away by train, which makes for a fascinating day trip.

DAYS 20 - 21: We head back into the Czech Republic, close to the historic towns of Ceske Budejovice and Ceske Krumlov. Both have beautifully preserved old towns and the former is home to the Budvar brewery.

DAY 22: We head into Bavaria today with a stop-over on the Romantic Road close to the small city of Augsburg.

DAY 23: We enter France today as we head for the Alsace region with chance to visit the stunning city of Strasbourg. A blend of French and German influences, it's half-timbered houses straddle the river in this lively city.

DAY 24: Today we head back into France to our final stopover in the Champagne region.

DAY 25: We head for Calais and our scheduled ferry crossing, or you may choose to extend your stay and take advantage of your flexible return ticket.

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS:

IN HUNGARY: Budapest, Lake Balaton, Fertő-Hanság National Park, Keszthely, Pannonhalma Abbey.

IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC: Prague, Brno, Ceske Budejovice, Ceske Krumlov, Bohemia.

IN AUSTRIA: Vienna.

IN SLOVAKIA: Bratislava, Trnava.

IN GERMANY: Bavaria, The Romantic Road, Nuremberg, The Rhine and Mosel Rivers.

IN LUXEMBOURG: Luxembourg City.

IN FRANCE: The Champagne and Alsace regions.
