

This tour provides a varied introduction to the mountains, lakes and cities of the Swiss and French Alps. Our route includes the distinctive Swiss capital of Bern, known for its unusual clock tower, medieval buildings and historic covered arcades. We then move the popular Interlaken region in the heart of the Swiss mountains with the chance to take the trains, funiculars and cable cars into the foothills. In France we spend time around Annecy with its cobbled streets, winding canals and pastel-coloured houses and of course, the famous lake. We also spend time in Geneva with its lake, water fountain and open parks. There will be an organised bus excursions to Geneva included as part of this tour and there is also time to visit them on your own if you wish.

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS:

IN FRANCE: Annecy, Mont Blanc, The French Alps.
IN SWITZERLAND: Bern, Interlaken, Geneva, The Swiss Alps, The Jungfrau, Eiger and Monch mountains, the Alpine cable cars, funiculars and railways.

- There are toll charges on French motorways.
- You need a low emission zone sticker for France.
- You will need to buy a vignette for Switzerland if you are under 3.5t. If you are over 3.5t you have to pay a daily toll charge on motorways and main roads.

NIGHT BEFORE: We stay on a campsite close to Dover where we provide a full briefing for the tour and advice on motorhoming on the continent in general. This is a complimentary night and youare welcome to join us at no additional cost.

DAYS 1 - 2: Over the next two days, we travel deep into France with overnight stops in the Champagne and Burgundy regions.

DAYS 3 - 6: The last of our busy driving days, on Day 3 we head into the Alpine region for the first time as we skirt the French Alps. We spend four nights close to the lake at Annecy. From here you can visit the famous towns and lakes of Annecy and Geneva. We will be providing a complimentary coach excursion to Geneva.

DAYS 7 - 8: We cross the border into Switzerland where we will stay for two nights near the distinctive capital, Bern. Our schedule allows for one full day in the city

DAYS 9 - 12: We head deep into the Swiss Alps for the next four days where we stay near Interlaken in the heart of the mountains. There are numerous options for accessing the lakes, valleys and peaks here using the local boats, trains, funiculars and cable cars.

DAYS 13 - 14: We drive into the rolling hills and forests of the Alsace region on the border with Germany. Our destination is the historic Strasbourg, a blend of French and German influences. Its half-timbered houses sit amongst more modern architecture in this lively city.

DAY 15: The last of our longer driving days, today we head into the Champagne region of France for our final stopover.

DAY 16: We head for the port and our scheduled crossing, or you may choose to extend your stay and take advantage of your flexible return ticket.
