Ltinerary

NIGHT BEFORE: We stay on a campsite close to Dover where we provide a full briefing for the tour and advice on motorhoming on the continent in general. This is a complimentary night and you are welcome to join us at no additional cost.

DAYS 1-2: We head down through France with overnight stops in the Champagne and Burgundy regions.

DAYS 3-4: We have a two night stopover in the French Alps, close to the famous Mont Blanc. There will be the opportunity to visit the local Alpine towns and foothills of the mountains.

DAY 5: We head through the Mont Blanc tunnel and through the Aosta Valley in Italy before spending a night in the Piedmont region.

DAYS 6-8: We head down towards the Italian Riviera today close to Genoa and then follow the spectacular coastline of the Cinque Terre into Tuscany. Our destination is on the coast near La Spezia, an ancient port town surrounded by popular beaches and resorts.

DAYS 9-11: Today we head towards Pisa with its famous leaning tower. In addition to the attractions around the

town, we are not far from the beautiful walled town of

DAYS 12-14: Over the next three nights we will be staying close to the 'capital' of Tuscany, Florence. Packed with art, architecture, fine wines and culinary treats, Florence is the home of Renaissance Italy and defines 'la dolce vita'. It is a must-see.

DAYS 15-17: We have a change of pace today with a chance to visit some of Tuscany's finest smaller towns and villages including Siena and San Gimignano. You can also pass through one of Italy's best known winegrowing regions, Chianti.

DAYS 18-20: We head back to the coast today with some time on the coast close to the historic town of Livorno. There is an eclectic mix of attractions in the town including a network of canals reminiscent of Venice. At the same time, it is a lively and modern city with lots of evidence of its importance as a trading port.

DAYS 21-25: We start the journey home retracing our steps with overnight stops in the Piedmont region of Italy, Mont Blanc, and the Burgundy and Champagne regions
