## ITINERARY:

**NIGHT BEFORE:** We stay on a campsite close to Dover where we provide a full briefing for the tour and advice on motorhoming on the continent in general. This is a complimentary night and you are welcome to join us at no additional cost.

**DAYS 1 - 2:** We head to Dover for our scheduled morning ferry crossing. We then have a short drive across to the world-heritage city of Bruges where we will spend two nights. Compact Bruges makes an excellent day-trip with its lively squares, network of narrow streets, canals and cafe culture.

**DAY 3:** We have a relatively short run today before our overnight stop in the Zeeland region. This little visited and sparsely populated area is characterised by islands and archipelago, and makes an interesting excursion en route to the better known areas of Holland.

**DAYS 4 - 7:** In contrast today we head to our well located site close to the centre of the country. Our campsite is a short walk to the train station with connections across the whole country giving you lots of options for travel further afield. This is a great base to visit Amsterdam, Utrecht, and the Keukenhof Gardens. At this time of year the gardens should be in full bloom with up to eight million bulbs.

**DAYS 8 - 9:** There is a change of pace today as we head north onto Lake Marketmeer. Attractions around the lake include two of Holland's most historic smaller towns of Edam and Hoorn. On the subject of cheese, the famous cheese-market town of Alkmaar is not far away.

**DAY 10:** We head across the Lake close to the Medieval town of Zwolle, where we have an overnight stop.

**DAYS 11 - 13:** We head into South Holland with our destination close to Maastricht. The city is a lively university town steeped in history dating back to Roman times. You can expect large squares, cobbled streets and fascinating architecture in amongst the cafes and restaurants. We also have a chance to visit Valkenburg, famed for its ruined castle and network of underground caves.

**DAYS 14 - 15:** We start our journey back towards Calais with time for a two-night stop close to the Opal Coast of Northern France. There is no shortage of pretty little towns and villages stretched along the coastline here.

**DAY 16:** We head for the port and our scheduled afternoon crossing, or you may choose to extend your stay and take advantage of your flexible return ticket.

- There are toll charges on French motorways.
- We recommend a low emission zone sticker for France.
