This tour provides an introduction to the Alpine regions of Switzerland and Austria. We then head into the Tyrol where we spend time near Innsbruck, Salzburg and Austria's highest peak, the Grossglockner. En route, you can visit the tiny principality of Liechtenstein. In the Tyrol, our well-equipped and well located Alpine campsites are ideal for exploring the mountains, local towns or larger cities further afield. We then head back through the Bavarian region of Germany with a two-night stop in Strasbourg before passing through the Alsace, Somme and Champagne regions of France on our route home.

- The Tyrol, Innsbruck, Salzburg, The Grossglockner, Zell am See, Swarovski Crystal, The Austrian Alps.
- Bern, Lake Constance, The Swiss Alps.
- The Champagne, Alsace, Burgundy and Alps regions.

- Bavaria, The Romantic Road, The Black Forest.





ITINERARY:

NIGHT BEFORE: We stay on a campsite close to Dover where we provide a full briefing for the tour and advice on motorhoming on the continent in general. This is a complimentary night and you are welcome to join us at no additional cost.

DAYS 1 - 2: Over the next two days, we travel deep into France with overnight stops in the Champagne and Burgundy regions.

DAYS 3 - 4: The last of our busy driving days, on Day 3 we head into the Alpine region for the first time as we skirt the French Alps. We cross the border into Switzerland where we will stay for two nights near the distinctive capital, Bern. Our schedule allows for a day and a half in the city.

DAYS 5 - 6: On Day 5 we enjoy a scenic drive as we head towards Lake Constance sitting on the borders of Switzerland, Germany and Austria, where we will spend two nights close to Liechtenstein.

DAYS 7 - 9: On Day 7 we head into the Tyrol to our first Alpine campsite close to Innsbruck. In addition to the town, other attractions include the crystal and silver mines, castles, steam railway and boat trips on Achensee, the Tyrol's largest lake. En route, there is the opportunity to visit the principality of Liechtenstein and its miniscule capital Vaduz, with a population of just 5000.

DAYS 10 - 13: Today we head further east into Austria toward Bruck in the Hohe Tauern National Park where we will spend four nights. Waterfalls, lakes, caves and the Grossglockner, Austria's highest peak, are all within a few miles of the campsite. This is also a great base to explore the wider area with Salzburg accessible by train.

DAY 14: We leave Austria today heading back through Bavaria in Germany where we will spend the night in the Augsburg/Ulm area close to the Romantic Road.


DAYS 15 - 16: We continue the journey north-west today heading first through (or round) the Black Forest before crossing the border back into France, where we spend two nights close to Strasbourg, allowing for a full day visit to the city.

DAY 17: The last of our longer driving days, today we head into the Champagne region of France for our final stopover.

DAY 18: We head for Calais and our scheduled afternoon crossing, or you may choose to extend your stay and take advantage of your flexible return
