

This 25-day tour takes us out through Germany with the chance to visit Berlin en route. We then embark on a grand round trip of Poland's most well-known destinations starting at Poznan and then travelling anti-clockwise to Wroclaw, Krakow and on to the capital Warsaw. From there we head up to the Medieval town of Torun before heading for the Baltic Coast at Gdansk. We follow the northern coastline across to Szczelin before re-entering Germany and our route home via the Netherlands. In addition to the main cities the tour incorporates lakes, forests, castles and even salt mines as we experience a rich, varied country with a long and sometimes turbulent history spanning over 1000 years.

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS:

IN POLAND: Warsaw, Krakow, Wroclaw, Poznan, Gdansk, Torun, Szczelin, Koszalin, Auschwitz, The Wieliczka Salt Mine, The Baltic Coast, The Brodnica Lake District.

IN GERMANY: Berlin, Potsdam, The Elbe River.

ITINERARY:

NIGHT BEFORE: We stay on a campsite close to Dover where we provide a full briefing for the tour and advice on motorhoming on the continent in general. This is a complimentary night and you are welcome to join us at no additional cost.

DAYS 1 - 2: Over the first two days we head through France and Belgium with overnights stops in The Netherlands and Germany.

DAYS 3 - 4: We head for Potsdam for a two-night stopover close to the German capital Berlin. Home to the Brandenburg Gate, which is one of Europe's most iconic monuments, the city is rich in history and culture.

DAYS 5 - 6: We enter Poland on Day 5 with our destination of Poznan, with its beautiful renaissance old town and pastel-coloured houses around the market square. En route, you can visit the world's tallest statue of Jesus!

DAYS 7 - 8: We head for the hills and countryside today staying close to the Czech border. Here we experience rural life with the foothills of the Sudetes mountain range as a backdrop.

DAYS 9-11: Our next destination is Poland's second largest city Krakow, which has probably the finest and grandest market square in the country. As a break from the city, you can visit the underground tunnels and caves of the

nearby Wieliczka Salt Mine or perhaps the royal palace of Wawel Castle. You may choose to pay homage at the Auschwitz Memorial.

DAYS 12 - 14: Our tour reaches the diverse capital of Warsaw. Old meets new here with a mixture of classical palaces and castles sitting alongside Soviet era housing blocks. It is truly one of Europe's most unique capital cities.

DAYS 15 - 16: There is a change of pace as we drive through rural Poland heading north to the Brodnica Lake District, an area of peaceful woodlands and lakes. You may choose to visit the UNESCO-listed medieval town of Torun on the River Vistula.

DAYS 17 - 19: Our destination tonight is the port of Gdansk on the Baltic Sea. Rich in ancient and modern history, the compact centre was extensively rebuilt in its original style after the war.

DAYS 20 - 21: We stick fairly close to the Baltic on the northern coastline, an area popular in the summer as it is Poland's only stretch of shoreline. You can expect low-key resort towns, spas and long flat beaches.

DAYS 22 - 25: We head back through Germany with stops in the east and west of the country before re-entering The Netherlands on our way back to Calais.
