Making a welcome return, this tour takes us down across the northern coast of Normandy before we enter Brittany following a circular route around the peninsula. Just a few of the places you can visit include Honfleur, The Normandy Landing Beaches, The iconic Mont St Michel, The Bayeux Tapestry, the fortified port of St Malo, picturesque Dinan, delightful Concarneau, the standing stones at Carnac and the historic fortified town of Fougères. Of course the beach is never far away too. This tour is ideal for first-timers who would like to get an introduction to motorhoming on the continent, while keeping the mileage relatively low. Experienced motorhomes of course, are also welcome!

**TOUR HIGHLIGHTS:**

**IN NORMANDY:** the Opal Coast, The Normandy Beaches, Mont St Michel, Honfleur, The Bayeux Tapestry, Rouen, Normandie Maine National Park.

**IN BRITTANY:** St Malo, Dinan, Dinard, St Brieuc, Carnac, Concarneau, Quimper.

**ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS/COSTS:**

- There are toll roads in France. We can advise on toll and non-toll routes.

**ITINERARY:**

**NIGHT BEFORE:** We stay on a campsite in Kent where we provide a full briefing for the tour and advice on motorhoming on the continent in general. We offer a free night if you stay with us on our designated campsite. Please let us know if you wish to join us.

**DAY 1:** We head to Dover Port for our scheduled morning crossing. On Night 1 we have a fairly short drive with a stopover in Neuchatel-en-Bray close near Rouen.

**DAYS 2 - 3:** Today we will head down The Opal Coast with our destination close to the pretty preserved port of Honfleur where we will spend two nights. There are many seaside towns and villages to visit on this stretch with sandy beaches and attractive cliffs. Honfleur itself is picture-postcard beautiful with no shortage of restaurants, cafes and local shops.

**DAYS 4 - 5:** We only have a short run today as we head west across the northern coast. The main attraction here is the Normandy Landing Beaches, which are accessible by road not far from the site. The Bayeux Tapestry is also a short drive away.

**DAY 6 - 7:** Our route takes us past Mont St Michel before we enter Brittany with our destination for the next two nights close to the walled port of St Malo. The island and abbey at Mont St Michel are a 'must-see' as are the ramparts and fortifications that surround the lively port of St Malo. Dinan and Dinard are also close by.

**DAYS 8 - 9:** We continue to follow the northern Brittany Coast with a two-nights stop close to St Brieuc. This stretch

of coastline is characterized by pink granite rocks along with elegant seaside towns and small fishing villages.

**DAY 10 - 12:** Today we head south to our campsite near Concarneau, where we will spend three nights. The Crozan peninsula and coastline are the stars of the show here with plenty of opportunities to visit the beaches and headlands. Along the southern peninsula you have the chance to visit Carnac, which boasts a collection of 2000 ancient standing stones spread across 4km.

**DAY 13 - 14:** We head inland today passing through Rennes en route to Fougères, where we spend two nights. The dynamic of the tour changes today as we move away from the coast into an area characterised by forests, medieval towns and chateaux. The pick of these is perhaps the formidable castle in Fougères itself.

**DAY 15 - 16:** Today we start the journey across Normandy, through the forests of the national park staying en route to the small town of Les Andelys. Nestling right on the banks of the Seine this pretty old town is dominated by the ruins of Château Gaillard on the hillside.

**DAY 17:** We head towards Calais with an overnight stop around 20 minutes from the port. Our campsite is close to a couple of interesting WW1 sites.

**DAY 18:** We head for the ferry today or you may choose to extend your stay and take advantage of your flexible return ticket.
